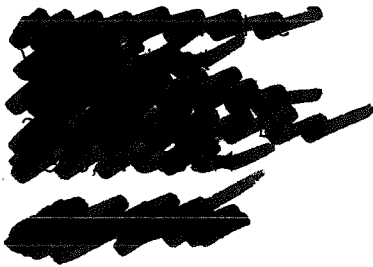

The following questions were raised seeking clarifications to answers to two questions in the final round.

19. The answer to question number nineteen on page five of the February 13, 2002, document titled New York Lottery Central System RFP Final Round of Questions & Answers seems to contradict the answer to question number 109 on page 26 of the January 23, 2002, document titled New York Lottery Central System RFP Questions & Answers. Our assumption is that the tracks are responsible for all electrical wiring and that the central system provider is responsible for connecting the central system to the site controllers and the site controllers to the VLTs. Is our assumption correct?
  - A. Your assumption is correct.
  
25. Question number 25 was not answered. This question appears in the last full paragraph on page 7 of the February 13, 2002, document titled New York Lottery Central System RFP Final Round of Questions & Answers.
  - A. The Lottery has provided vendors with the price evaluation methodology. In the RFP, Section 3.9 states that the Central System be sized to support a minimum of 9,750 VLTs at startup. Further, it asked vendors to describe upgrades necessary to support up to 20,000 VLTs.

The Lottery appreciates the intent of the question raised but does not agree with the recommendation of incrementing the price based on the number of terminals. Accordingly, the price as described in the amended RFP will be followed.
