




Fiscal Year 2009-2010 Year-End Review

With a 10th consecutive year of record sales, the New York Lottery ended fiscal year 2009-2010 with increases in sales and profit in both the Traditional Lottery and Video Gaming businesses. In total, the Lottery produced \$2.67 billion in profit from \$7.82 billion in sales and "net win" (casino revenue). All of the Lottery's profits go to funding K-12 education in New York State, and the Lottery's earnings represent over 12 percent of total state funding to local school districts.

Total sales and "net win" increased \$158.2 million or 2.1 percent over the prior fiscal year; profits increased \$122.9 million or 4.8 percent over the same time period.



Total New York Lottery Sales & Net Win: \$7.82 Billion - Aid to Education: \$2.67 Billion




Traditional Lottery (FY 2009-2010)

\$1.037 Billion in Net Win*





The above amounts are based on the New York State Education Department's Division of Aid to Localities for Education from the State Lottery Fund as required by law. For a complete listing visit nylottery.org.

Lottery revenue is distributed to local school districts by the same statutory formula used to distribute other state aid to education. It takes into account both a school district's size and its income level; larger, lower-income school districts receive proportionately larger shares of Lottery school funding.
