The following are the New York State Gaming Commission's restricted administration times for the 24 therapeutic medications that will be subject in New York to ARCI national thresholds effective January 1, 2015:

| Betamethasone | 7 days |
| Butorphanol | 96 hours |
| Clenbuterol | 14 days |
| Dantrolene | 72 hours |
| Detomidine | 96 hours |
| Dexamethasone | 5 days |
| Diclofenac | 48 hours |
| DMSO | 48 hours |
| Firocoxib | 14 days |
| Flunixin | 48 hours |
| Furosemide | 48 hours / Race Day* |
| Glycopyrrolate | 96 hours |
| Ketoprofen | 48 hours |
| Lidocaine | 96 hours |
| Mepivacaine | 96 hours |
| Methocarbamol | 72 hours |
| Methylprednisolone | Pre-entry Test < 100 pg/ml threshold |
| Omeprazole | 24 hours |
| Phenylbutazone | 48 hours |
| Prednisolone | 5 days |
| Procaine penicillin | 7 days |
| Triamcinolone acetonide | 7 days |
| Xylazine | 96 hours |

Note: Betamethasone, and any formulation of methylprednisolone or triamcinolone are limited to intra-articular administration only.

*Race day furosemide is strictly regulated by Commission rule 4043.2 (b)
