





Attributes of Slot Accounting System

Submit as Exhibit VIII.C.6.d. a description of the attributes of the slot accounting system that is planned for Applicant's operation, which allows the Gaming Commission access for the purposes of auditing revenues and game status.

Montreign Operating Company, LLC will conduct a Request for Bid ("RFB") to determine and select the slot accounting system that provides the functionality desired, as well as the security and system access necessary to comply with the Commission's Regulations. Montreign will evaluate several providers of slot accounting systems, including IGT, Bally Technologies, Multimedia Games, Konami and Iverson. The RFB process is necessary to compare core functionality and determine the vendor that will offer a complete solution to meet Montreign's needs, and will allow the Commission access for the purpose of



auditing revenues and game status. Both the Montreign Executive Team and Montreign's gaming consultant have experience in the acquisition and use of the various slot accounting systems that may be offered.

The companies listed below offer slot accounting systems that have a proven record of compliance and regulatory acceptance in various states and by tribal governments, and they have been licensed and approved by State and Tribal gaming regulatory agencies. Their acceptance and use in these states and various casino environments, along with the casino expertise of Montreign's management,

assures that Montreign will be able to acquire a slot accounting system that meets the requirements of the Commission, including requirements related to the auditing of revenues and game status.

Each slot accounting system offered by these vendors includes core functionality components that serve as the standard for reliability, accuracy, accountability and user/guest friendly applications. These slot accounting systems include: accurate and reliable real time or on demand reporting for slot accounting and analysis; cashless wagering and Ticket-in Ticket-out (“TITO”) options; a cage, credit and vault solution for the redemption of gaming tickets and drop count reconciliation; progressive jackpot and meter monitoring security/alert functionality; ticketing jackpots; and guest bonus and reward integrations direct to the slot machines. The five identified vendors have spent years designing and developing casino systems based on input from operators and regulators to create casino systems that offer operational efficiency and security. All systems have received certifications from Gaming Labs International, LLC, which has been setting the standard for testing systems globally in 455 jurisdictions since 1989. The diverse client list for each vendor shows the flexibility of these systems to fit into different environments and jurisdictions. Bally Technologies’ system is used by Caesar’s Entertainment, Pinnacle Entertainment, Penn National Gaming and Mohegan Sun, while IGT’s system is utilized at Three Rivers, Firekeepers Casino, Casino de la Vallee and Bonaza Casino. Multimedia Games’ product is currently used in all New York VGM facilities, while Konami’s system is used at Turning Stone Resort Casino, Rhythm City Casino and the Echo Entertainment Group properties in Australia. Iverson, one of the newest vendors in the industry, has been used at Seven Luck Casino and Palms Casino, as well as on cruise ships such as Carnival, MSC Cruises, and Aida Cruises.

Ultimately, following a full comparison of the slot accounting systems offered by these vendors during the RFB process, Montreign will select a slot accounting system that will include a slot management, slot accounting and cash and cage solution that will offer advanced and proven audit capabilities, a single ticket solution for all slot manufacturers, the ability to view game performance metrics down to the machine level, and the ability to generate thorough and detailed reports. The slot accounting system machine selected by Montreign will allow the Commission access for the purposes of auditing revenues and game status.
