


The New York State Gaming Commission's Lottery Division is proud to offer this year-end overview of its record-breaking traditional and video gaming operations for Fiscal Year 2015-16. All profits, less prizes paid, retailer commissions and administrative expenses, from the Lottery's gaming operations are used to support aid to education.

The New York Lottery's combined profit from its traditional lottery and video lottery businesses continue to lead the nation with a record year-end contribution to education totaling \$3.30 billion. Combined sales and net win for the same time period totaled \$9.69 billion.



Total New York Lottery Sales & Net Win: \$9.69 Billion - Aid to Education: \$3.30 Billion




Traditional Lottery (FY 2015-2016)

The above amounts are based on the New York State Education Department's Division of Aid to Localities for Education from the State Lottery Fund as required by law. For a complete listing visit nylottery.ny.gov.

Lottery revenue is distributed to local school districts by the same statutory formula used to distribute other state aid to education. It takes into account both a school district's size and its income level; larger, lower-income school districts receive proportionately larger shares of Lottery school funding.
